

 HC and JS met Ben Godfrey Henni Ouahes, Gwen Edmunds and Ben Godfrey on 5/4/23. 	
 LC is looking at CPO reform, not DCO process.

1.42 To review the law (legislation, case law and common law rules) relating to:	
 the procedures governing the acquisition of land and interests in land by the making, confirmation, and implementation of compulsory purchase orders, or by agreement; 	
the principles governing the assessment of compensation:	
(a) for such acquisition;	
 (b) where such acquisition is contemplated but not proceeded with; and 	
 (c) for severance, disturbance, injurious affection, and other related matters. 	
1.43 To produce a draft Bill or Bills, consolidating and codifying such law and making technical changes, ensuring that the law is modernised, simplified, accessible, technically sound and internally consistent as necessary.	
1.44 To review, and consult stakeholders about, compulsory purchase powers with a view to identifying possible anomalies or inconsistencies that make them unfit for purpose.	
 The impression given was it was very much a consolidation exercise; not a 	
reform one.	
• Since the above meeting, the LC have reached out to various individual	
members of the board and it appears their interest includes reform. It is clear	
they are seeking ideas and questions to ask in the consultation paper.	
• The board should therefore be bold in sharing its ideas and we need to do this	
so that they have time to incorporate them into their thinking for the	



	 road test to senior members of the industry. Our intention is for the LC to attend, as they have traditionally done.
